St. Joseph Parish is seeking a part-time Organist (approximately 5-6 hours per week) to begin on or before November 1, 2016.

The Organist will be responsible for:

- Playing two (2) Sunday liturgies (8:00 am, 9:30 am) a week at St. Rose of Lima Church in Chesapeake City, MD [two-manual Allen Protégé organ]
- Playing two (2) Saturday evening (5:00 pm) services a month at St. Joseph Church in Middletown, DE [three-manual Allen Renaissance organ and a grand piano]
- Selecting appropriate preludes, postludes, or other solo pieces for worship
- Working collaboratively with the assigned cantor for each liturgy

The Organist will be responsible occasionally for special services, including but not limited to:

• Christmas, Ash Wednesday, Holy Week, seasonal Evening Prayer liturgies, holy days of obligation, special musical events

Opportunities for additional income from funerals and weddings are available.

The successful candidate should possess:

- Excellent skills in organ and piano, have a solid background in service playing, and knowledge of the Catholic liturgy
- The ability to work collegially with the Coordinator of Music Ministry, other musicians, clergy and other church staff

The mission of our music ministry is to serve the parish by leading and uplifting the assembly's sung worship. The music at St. Joseph Parish is a mix of traditional and contemporary styles sung by the entire community.
