professional singer and is Co-founder and *Artistic Director of Lyric Fest, a thematic* recital series in Philadelphia. She holds a Bachelor's Degree from Loyola University in her native New Orleans, a Master's in Performance and Literature from Eastman School of Music, and trained in opera at the Academy of Vocal Arts, earning an Artist Diploma and subsequently singing opera throughout the United States for over a decade. Suzanne has taught voice privately and at Haverford and Bryn Mawr Colleges since 2000, and has been the voice coach for Bryn Mawr Presbyterian Church's Sing for *Life choir since it was founded – a cherished* part of her week. She greatly enjoys sharing her love of singing and her knowledge of vocal technique with singers of all levels, helping her students and choir members to get the most out of their voices.

VICTORIA R. SIROTA is an *Episcopal* priest, organist, lecturer and author, holds degrees from Oberlin Conservatory of Music, Boston University and Harvard Divinity School. She has taught at Yale Divinity School and Yale Institute of Sacred Music, The Ecumenical Institute of Theology at St. Mary's Seminary and *University, and Boston University.* Former National Chaplain for the American Guild of Organists, Chair of the Professional Concerns Committee for the Association of Anglican Musicians, and Coordinator of the 1990 National AGO Convention in Boston, she is the author of articles, reviews and texts for hymns, cantatas and song cycles. Her book Preaching to the Choir: Claiming the Role of Sacred Musician is available from Church Publishing. For nine years she served as Canon Pastor and Vicar at The Cathedral Church of Saint John the Divine in New York, and is currently Rector of Saint John's Episcopal Church in Getty Square, Yonkers, NY.
